

Delivering fast, competitive racing, New Zealand's premier single-seater category attracts drivers from around the globe. The Castrol Toyota Racing Series (TRS) is New Zealand's fastest racing category providing winter training in a southern hemisphere two FIA-sanctioned Grand Prix race events

Moving into the 16th season as New Zealand's premier category, TRS is as exciting, fast and closely fought as ever.

The only class in New Zealand motorsport that offers aspiring racers vital experience with wings, slicks and composite technologies, TRS is Toyota's commitment to nurturing our next generation of top level racing talent. No other manufacturer has made the same long term commitment to motorsport as Toyota New Zealand.

Drivers in the National Championship series compete for almost every major title and trophy in the sport. The series attracts Premier Gold Star status along with the New Zealand Grand Prix title, one of only outside of Formula One, making it a truly world class motorsport event.

TRS cars lap New Zealand circuits faster than an NZV8 and more than six seconds faster than Formula Ford. A level of investment unmatched by any other manufacturer demonstrates Toyota's commitment to finding the next generation of racers and giving them the best possible stepping stone to the next level of

New Zealand's premier single-seater category is the fastest and most competitive class in New Zealand.


The new FT-60 - the third car the series will have used in a championship that stretches back 15 years - is a state-of-the-art racing machine that is more like a scaled down Formula One car than either of the two FT-50.


Designed like the previous two series cars by Italian manufacturer Tatuus, the chassis

is similar to that used in other global junior formulae, but will use a new engine that will pack a powerful 270 horsepower (200 kW) making it one of the best performing junior cars on the FIA's recognised pathway to Formula One.

The new car features all of the recent key safety initiatives developed by the FIA in previous machines, the FT-40 and the conjunction with Formula One. The design incorporates a 'halo' driver protection system to protect the driver from side, top and frontal impact from debris in an accident and also features the very latest


in side and front impact technology in the chassis itself. Twin wheel tethers are included in the design to prevent wheels flying off in the event of a crash, another feature straight out of Formula One. The car has undergone 36 controlled crash tests in the laboratory to ensure it meets the highest standards of safety in the sport





FIA SUPER LICENCE





With Callum llott confirmed as test driver for Alfa Romeo Racing at Barcelona post event testing, no less than fifteen graduates of the series have now made it to Formula One as race or test drivers. The Castrol Toyota Racing Series is the only series available

at this time of year to drivers worldwide which offers FIA Super Licence points that can go towards securing a driver a licence to run in official F1 practice sessions during a Grand Prix weekend or eventually, a race seat in F1 itself.

Earn Formula One **Super Licence Points**

For a second year running, the Castrol Toyota Racing Series has been included in the table of points for an FIA Super Licence.

Therefore the top 5 drivers in the championship standing will be awarded with the following points:

1st: 7pts | **2nd**: 5pts | **3rd**: 3pts | **4th**: 2pts | **5th**: 1pt

What is a Super Licence?

The FIA Super Licence is a qualification allowing the licence holder to compete in the Formula One World Championship as a driver.

Some criteria for the licence are:

- The Driver must be at least 18 years old at the start of their first F1 race event.
- The first time he/she applies for a Super Licence, the driver must have completed at least 80% of each of two full seasons of any single-seater championships listed by the FIA (of which TRS is now one).
- Have accumulated at least 40 points during the three year period preceding their application (the results of a maximum two championships can be accumulated in a single calendar year)

Kiwi Driver Fund

Launched in the 2015 season, the Kiwi Driver Fund was created to address concerns about the ability of our local drivers to achieve and maintain the level of funding required to compete at the highest level. There are many instances where the potential of kiwi talent may not be realised because they cannot raise the necessary funding. Kiwi Driver Fund is managed by five trustees who review applications for funding and make annual grants.

The objective of the fund is to give qualifying kiwi drivers a funding 'kick-start' by covering some of their cost to compete in the Castrol Toyota Racing Series and hopefully find New Zealand's next world champions. Applicants are required to submit a full resume and plan for their future careers as well

as demonstrate a high level of communication skills. They are expected to have most of their funding and team in place with the Kiw Driver Fund supplementing this as a boost to their careers.



CHRIS AMON TROPHY

Awarded to the driver gaining the highest aggregate points overall from all five rounds constituting the championship.

- 1st overall \$20,000 NZD
- 2nd overall \$10,000 NZD
 3rd overall \$5,000 NZD

INTERNATIONAL DRIVER'S CHAMPION

The Castrol Toyota Racing Series International Trophy is awarded to the driver gaining the highest aggregate points overall from all five rounds constituting the Series.

Note: To register as an "International Driver" a driver must not be a New Zealand passport holder and must currently hold an FIA International race licence from an ASN other than MotorSport NZ.

TRANS TASMAN TROPHY

All NZ and Australian competitors who complete all rounds of the Championship are eligible to compete for the Trans Tasman Trophy which is awarded to the highest placed eligible competitor.

- 1st overall \$10,000 NZD
- 2nd overall \$7,000 NZD
- 3rd overall \$3,000 NZD

BUTCHER CUP

Awarded to the highest overall points scorer, this trophy is presented at the MotorSport New Zealand (MSNZ) annual awards function along with the MSNZ Race Gold Star (for single seaters).

BRUCE MCLAREN TROPHY

Presented to the highest placed New Zealand passport holder at the MotorSport New Zealand annual awards function.

TEAMS CHAMPIONSHIP TROPHY

The TRS Teams Championship Trophy is awarded to the team gaining the highest aggregate points overall from all five rounds constituting the Championship based on the highest placed drivers from each team in each race.

- 1st \$3,000 NZD
- 2nd \$2,000 NZD

ROOKIE OF THE YEAR*

The TRS Rookie of the Year Trophy is awarded to the rookie driver gaining the highest aggregate points overall from all five rounds constituting the championship. Along with the trophy, the Rookie of Year receives an Engine Lease for the following season.

*To be eligible for the Castrol Toyota Racing Series Rookie of the Year Trophy, drivers must have entered and competed in no more than three rounds of any previous Toyota Racing Series Championship and must have entered and competed in no more than three rounds of any equivalent or higher level single-seater formula within the last 12 months.

The Denny Hulme Memorial Trophy is awarded to the winner of the feature race of round three of the championship.

THE NEW ZEALAND MOTOR CUP

The New Zealand Motor Cup is awarded to the winner of the feature race of round four of the championship.

DAN HIGGINS TROPHY

The Dan Higgins Trophy is awarded to the winner of the first race of round five of the championship.

ROAD TO INDY PARTNERSHIP



USF2000, INDY PRO 2000, OR INDY LIGHTS TESTING OPPORTUNITY

The Road to Indy Presented by Cooper Tires and Toyota GAZOO Racing New Zealand announced a partnership that will see up-and-coming drivers afforded new opportunities in both series to further their racing careers. Several drivers in the Road to Indy have already taken advantage of the opportunity to sharpen their skills in the off-season by participating in the January/February Castrol Toyota Racing Series.

The new partnership will offer the top-three finishers in the Road to Indy ladder series – the Cooper Tires USF2000 Championship, the Indy Pro 2000 Championship Presented by Cooper Tires and Indy Lights Presented by Cooper Tires – a waived entry fee (NZ\$5,000, approximately \$3,300 USD) for the 2020 Castrol Toyota Racing Series season. This is a fantastic opportunity to hone their skills with significant track time at five circuits on New Zealand's North and South Islands aboard the newly unveiled state-of-the-art Tatuus FT-60.

For drivers who have competed in all five rounds of the 2019 Castrol Toyota Racing Series, an opportunity to test the waters in either USF2000, Indy Pro 2000 or Indy Lights is on offer with entry fees waived for the traditional two-day Chris Griffis Memorial test this fall or the two-day Spring Training outing at the beginning of next year. All drivers will also receive one set of Cooper tires for the test event they select.

In addition, joint marketing programs will be implemented to showcase the Road to Indy as an excellent career option for aspiring young drivers who want to follow the path of New Zealand racing legend Scott Dixon, five time NTT IndyCar Series champion, Indianapolis 500 winner and former Indy Lights champion, and to highlight the benefits of off-season training in the Castrol Toyota Racing Series in preparation for full-season campaigns.


